- LOVE**
Be there for your child and show care and love
- EXERCISE**
Encourage play, exercise and sport
- BEHAVIOUR**
Keep an eye out for any changes in behaviour
- SUPPORT**
Regularly support, encourage and praise your child
- REST TIME**
Help your child to manage stress by building in some rest time
- BE PROUD**
Tell your child that you are proud of them
- PATIENCE**
Be patient. Don't pressure your child
- HELP**
Don't be afraid to seek help from professionals
- FEELING**
Get to know how your child is feeling
- EDUCATE**
Educate yourself about mental health problems
- PROBLEM SOLVING**
Help your child to effectively problem solve
